Methodology

Project's guidelines on ISS (A2.5):

- 5 days, 40 learning hours
- In English
- Beneficiaries: students who attended previous national summer/winter schools
- The on-site presence of both students and professors is highly preferable. Owing to the current COVID-19 pandemic and in compliance with national safety restrictions, participants are nevertheless granted with the opportunity to attend the International Summer School online.

Structure

The lectures should be aimed at deepening the connections between the 2030 Agenda, selected SDGs, and migration. The main themes, which lectures should be focused on, are:

The 5-day lesson plan is to be divided into theme-baskets, where each SDG is unpacked, data are provided and a special emphasis is given on its direct and indirect linkages with (regular/irregular; low-skilled/high-skilled) migration. Moreover, each SDG should be analysed from a specific and relevant perspective.
