1. City Council Department of Public rights: Immigration Unit

A) PANGEA, MIGRANT'S ASSISTANCE OFFICE

It provides the services of reception, information, guidance, intercultural mediation and legal advice for foreigners living in the city of Alicante.

It is made up of three services:

- 1. Service of Assessment and Issuance of reports on social integration and habitability of housing:
- Social Integration Report: this is a document to accredit social integration in the city in the process of obtaining a temporary residence permit for exceptional circumstances due to social integration. A personal interview will take place and the corresponding report will be drawn up.
- Housing Habitability Report: they accredit the suitability of the house in the process of obtaining a residence permit for family reunification or of renewing it if the home address has changed. The documentation and the application must be submitted at the General Registry by appointment at the SAIC.

2. Assistance, Information and Mediation Service:

This involves personalised first reception, information and guidance, as well as cultural and linguistic mediation actions to promote social integration.

3. Legal Advice Service:

It provides legal guidance and advice to migrants on legal rights issues.

To receive assistance in person at the different services, it is necessary to phone the corresponding office and make an appointment.

B) TRAINING FOR MIGRANTS

Classroom-based and/or online Spanish courses for foreigners, who live in the municipality of Alicante and who are 18 or older.

The National Health System in Spain is universal and free of charge in primary care (Health Centres) and Hospital Emergency Care. In the Valencian Community there is a document that allows access to the health system and certifies the right to public health care, called the **SIP card**.

Situations to be taken into account:

1. EU foreigners

In order to access to healthcare in Spain, you must have applied for a European healthcare card in your country of origin. Once in Spain, you can go to the health centre closest to your place of residence and present this card together with the census registration certificate and obtain the healthcare card. It is important to make an appointment for any information with the Social Work Unit of the Health Centre in your area.

2. People from Chile, Andorra, Morocco, Tunisia and Peru (the 5 countries with social security agreements with Spain)

o be entitled to healthcare in Spain, you must go to the health centre closest to your place of residence and submit the identification documentation and the health accreditation that justifies your origin. This way, the Temporary Inclusion Document will be obtained.

3. Undocumented foreigners

They should go to the **health centre** closest to their place of residence and request an appointment at the Social Work Unit of the local Health Centre, which will assess whether to the person's inclusion in the Valencian Health System, as long as they have been in the Valencian Community for 3 months and have a certificate of census registration.

As for a **hospital emergency**, everyone is entitled to get medical assistance for a serious disease or accident, until they are discharged from hospital.

WHO CAN APPLY FOR THE SIP CARD?

Foreigners without a residence permit in the following cases:

- Women who need assistance during pregnancy, childbirth and postpartum.
- Minors under the same conditions as Spanish minors.
- AAsylum seekers or victims of trafficking (this will be processed through the Social Work Unit of the local Health Centre).
- Individuals who do not have a valid visa or residence permit and are not registered in the EU Citizens Register, who have been living in Spain for more than 90 days, who are not entitled to cross- border healthcare assistance or by any other means.

WHERE CAN YOU APPLY FOR THE SIP CARD?

The SIP card is processed in each of the Health Centres, so go to the one closest to your place of residence.

There are 13 Health Centres (CS) and 2 General Hospitals in Alicante.

ALTERNATIVE HOUSING AND ACCOMMODATION

Foreigners with a residence permit in Spain are entitled to access the public housing aid system under the same conditions as Spanish citizens, as long as they meet the requirements for access to the different housing programmes.

Schooling in Spain is compulsory and free for children between the ages of 6 and 16, although children can start school when they are 3 and, in some schools, when they are 2.

Schools are for students from 2-3 to 12 years of age and Secondary Schools (IES) for students from 12 to 16 years old.

In the city of Alicante there are two Municipal Nursery Schools where children from 4 months to 2 years of age attend free of charge.

WHO CAN APPLY FOR A PLACE?

The father, the mother or the legal guardians **must enrol** their children in school. The application must be submitted online at the following link: http://www.telematricula.es/, and it must be signed by both parents or the legal representative of the student, unless it can be proved that it is impossible to do so, or if any of them does not have parental authority.

HOW TO APPLY?

They will have to go to the school or the nursery school closest to the child's home address where the enrolment is to take place, during the deadlines and periods established for each educational stage, and follow the instructions.

If the enrolment **takes place after the established deadline**, the Education Service of Alicante City Council will inform you the publicly funded schools that have places available in Pre-school Education, Primary Education and Compulsory Secondary Education. about the places available. For vacancies in Bachillerato (Higher Secondary Education), Basic, Intermediate and Advanced Vocational Training (Formación Profesional or FP), you should consult the Department of Education or the schools themselves.

To go to the Education Service you will have to make an **appointment and submit the required documentation** to apply for a school place. Further details can be found in the following link:



The Valencian Community is made up of three provinces: Castellón, Valencia and Alicante, where the two co-official languages are **Spanish and Valencian**.



The official currency in Spain is the Euro (€).



In Spain the age of majority is acquired at 18 years.

Rights of foreigners in Spain

All foreigners in Spain, regardless of their legal situation, enjoy the inherent human rights as individuals: right to life, to physical and mental integrity and to ideological freedom.

In Spain the right to education, academic freedom, personal, ideological and religious freedom, the right of assembly and association, among others, are recognised.

To live in Spain

a) Temporary residence: this is when foreigners are allowed to stay in Spain for a period of more than 90 days and less than five years. The initial temporary residence permit that is not considered to be a work permit will be granted to foreigners who have sufficient financial means to cover their expenses of living in the country and, where appropriate, those of their family.

b) Long-term residence: this is when foreigners are allowed to live and work in Spain for an indefinite period of time, in the same conditions as Spanish nationals. Foreign citizens who have been granted temporary residence in Spain for five years on a continuous basis and satisfy the applicable regulatory conditions are entitled to long-term residence. Furthermore, the previous and on-going periods of residence in other member States of anyone in possession of the EU blue card will also be taken into account.





To study in Spain

There are two procedures: if you come to Spain with your study visa or if you apply for it once you are here.

Foreigners who wish to stay in Spain to study or extend their studies in an authorised teaching centre in Spain, in a full-time program leading to obtaining a degree or certificate of studies, **must be legally residing in Spain (with a visa or other)** and submit their application at least one month before the expiration date of their status.

They may be authorised to engage in employed or self-employed activities, provided that those activities are compatible with their studies and do not exceed 30 hours per week.

To work in Spain

Foreigners who intend to carry out any lucrative, occupational or professional activity in Spain must meet the following requirements:

- a) Be at least 16 years of age (unless you are self-employed, in which case you must be 18 or older).
- **b) Obtain the corresponding prior authorisation** to reside and work in Spain.

There are different ways to obtain a residence and work permit.
